4. Answer any four of the following questions : $10 \times 4 = 40$

- (a) Discuss how Ashima negotiates her identity at different stages of her life, as a newly-wed bride, a young mother, a mother whose children have left home, and a widow.
- (b) Rohinton Mistry's *A Fine Balance* aptly exposes the rural/urban divide in the context of post-colonial India. Discuss.
- (c) Describe how Ashima in *The Namesake* reinvents herself after her experiences of geo-cultural dislocation.
- (d) Critically discuss some of the major themes Vassanji addresses in *The Book of Secrets*.

- (e) How does Meera Syal articulate the anxieties of the diaspora in *Anita and Me*? Write a well-thoughtout answer.
- (f) What purpose does the diary of Albert Corbin serve in the plot of *The Book of Secrets*? Give a well-reasoned answer.
- (g) Critically comment on Anita and Meena's relationship in *Anita and Me*.
- (h) Distancing herself from the political issues of the time Dina says :

“Government problems and games played by people in power ... doesn't affect ordinary people like us.”

But in the end it does affect all of them drastically.

Discuss with reference to the lives of the characters in Mistry's *A Fine Balance* how the individual is affected by the larger socio-political changes in the public sphere.
